

MOTION: University Core A, College Core A, and College Core B Curriculum
Referred by: Faculty Senate Executive Council

Motion

The Faculty Senate recommends the approval for the proposed listing of courses in University Core B (Mathematical Sciences, Natural Sciences, Humanities, Fine Arts, and Social/Behavioral Sciences), College Core A (Global Perspectives and U.S. Perspectives), and College Core B (Natural Sciences/Mathematical Sciences, Humanities/Fine Arts/Foreign Languages, and Social/Behavioral Sciences/Health & Wellness).

Rationale

As the voice of faculty, and consistent with University internal governance policies, the Faculty Senate is provided the opportunity to review and comment upon the courses proposed for the categories of University Core B, College Core A, and College Core B. This listing of courses has been approved by the General Education Curriculum Advisory Committee and subsequently forwarded to the Faculty Senate for review and comment.

Explanatory Notes: As currently proposed,

1. University Core B consists of five areas: Mathematical Sciences, Natural Sciences, Humanities, Fine Arts, and Social/Behavioral Sciences. The courses listed in the column titled “High Priority Courses” would count for credit in each of those areas. The courses listed in the column titled “Proposed Deletions” would not count for credit in each of those areas.
 2. College Core A consists of two areas: Global Perspectives and U.S. Perspectives. In the box titled “College Core A,” the courses listed under the respective column headings would count in those areas.
 3. College Core B consists of three areas:
 - a. Natural Sciences or Mathematical Sciences: The Natural Sciences and Mathematical Sciences courses approved for University Core A would also be listed under this category.
 - b. Humanities, Fine Arts, or Foreign Languages: The Humanities and Fine Arts courses approved for University Core A would also be listed under this category, as would the Foreign Language courses in the box titled “College Core B.”
 - c. Social/Behavioral Sciences or Health and Wellness: The Social/Behavioral Science courses approved for University Core A would also be listed under this category, as would the Health and Wellness courses in the box titled “College Core B.”
