Appalachian State University		No requirement at the undergraduate level unless you are majoring in English, a foreign language, or International Business. They do require on foreign culture course.
Bloomsburg University of PA		No requirement at the Undergraduate level I the core courses. Some majors, such as foreign languages, do require courses.
California State University-Chico		No requirement at the undergraduate level unless you are majoring in a foreign language or in International Relations
California State University-San Bernardino	Do require four units of the same language; exceptions are Spanish for Spanish Speakers (require only one unit) and for transfers from community colleges (one unit).	
Gonzaga University	Undergraduate degree for Arts and Sciences: 1 foreign language course <b>or</b> a foreign culture course for at least one semester as a core requirement.	No requirement for Business, Engineering, Applied Sciences or Professional Programs (Nursing, Physiology).
Hofstra University		Undergraduate degrees (BA and BS) do <b>not</b> have a foreign language component. Foreign language courses are elective only unless it is your degree major.
Indiana University of PA—Main Campus	Undergraduate degrees (BA and BS) <b>do</b> have a foreign language component for all majors. -If a student takes 100 level foreign language courses; s/he is required to take 8 credit hours or have a "satisfactory score" on a	

	<p>placement test. OR</p> <p>- A student can take only 200 level foreign language courses; s/he required to take 6 credit hours of a language.</p>	
Kutztown University of PA		Undergraduate degrees (BA and BS) do <b>not</b> have a foreign language component. Foreign language courses are elective only unless it is your degree major.
Loyola Marymount University		Undergraduate degrees (BA and BS) do <b>not</b> have a foreign language component. Foreign language courses are elective only unless it is your degree major.
Minnesota State University-Mankato		Undergraduate degrees (BA and BS) do <b>not</b> have a foreign language component. Foreign language courses are elective only unless it is your degree major.
Monmouth University		Undergraduate degrees (BA and BS) do <b>not</b> have a foreign language component. Foreign language courses are elective only unless it is your degree major.
Rowan University		Undergraduate degrees (BA and BS) do <b>not</b> have a foreign language component. Foreign language courses are elective only unless it is your degree major.
Saint Cloud State University	<p>Admission requirements: ... “two or more years of the same foreign language”...</p> <p>“Students who enter the University without completing the above course of study may be required to make up the course work or demonstrate skill levels and competencies.”</p>	<p>May choose For1 (one course) among many to satisfy Liberal Education Program.</p> <p>B.A.: “Majors below 45 credits require one year in a single foreign language OR a minor.”</p> <p>B.S.: No mention of language requirements in general.</p>

Salisbury University	Admission requirements: "...a prospective student should have met the following minimum requirements...and two years in a foreign language. Students lacking any of the above admissions specifications should contact the dean of admissions."	May choose Forl (one course) among many to satisfy General Education Program.  B.A. / B.S.: No.
Seattle University	Admissions: "Successful candidates complete the following minimal program in high school (each unit is equivalent to one academic year of study):... Foreign language - 2 units."	B.A. / B.S.: No. Not even an option in the Core Curriculum.
SUNY College at Brockport	<p>Admissions: "However, most students who enter Brockport today have:... •3 years or more of a foreign language"</p> <p>Yes: "Students are required to complete the equivalent of one year of a foreign language as a General Education requirement."</p> <p>B.A.: Competency in one Forl: "1. Successful completion of the second semester of the intermediate year of college instruction in a foreign language (212), or a more advanced course; or 2. Successful completion of four or more years of one foreign language in high school and the appropriate score on a standardized test administered by The College at Brockport Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures."</p> <p>B.S. : Not above Gen Ed.</p>	
Texas Christian University		Undergraduate degrees (BA and BS) do <b>not</b> have a foreign language component. Foreign language courses are elective only unless it is your degree

		major. May test out of foreign language as elective depending on scores from standardized testing.
University of Northern Colorado		Undergraduate degrees (BA and BS) do <b>not</b> have a foreign language component. Foreign language courses are elective only unless it is your degree major or required for your major.
University of Northern Iowa	<p>All students entering UNI who graduated from high school in 1989 or thereafter are required to demonstrate a level of competence in a foreign language (classical or modern) equivalent to that achieved after the second semester at the college level. One year of foreign language in high school is considered to be equivalent to one semester of foreign language at the university.</p> <p>Can place out if achieved satisfactory (C-) completion: of two years of high school study in one foreign language; of a combination of high school and college study in one language equivalent to the competence achieved after the second semester at the college level; performance on an achievement examination measured proficiency equivalent to that attained after the second semester of college study in one foreign language; or completed either two years of high school study or one year of college study or the combined equivalent in American Sign Language (ASL).</p>	
University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire		Not university-wide but College of A&S requires FL for a B.A. Can be used as a choice for the FL/Foreign Culture requirement by some colleges.
University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh		Not university-wide but required for the B.A. Can be used as a choice for certain other degrees.
Western Carolina University		A choice in "Liberal Studies" (Gen

		Ed) 3- hr "World Cultures" requirement. Required for certain majors in the BA.
William Patterson University of NJ	6-credits required of all students at the Basic or Intermediate level depending on placement test given to all incoming students.	
Winthrop University		Required in many B.S. and B.A. degrees but does not seem to be a university-wide requirement
